Economics

Levelling-up is an economic challenge: it's about productivity and GVA

Society

Levelling up is a social challenge: it's about the social resilience of places in an uncertain world

Cultures

Levelling-up is a cultural challenge: its about the perception and self-perception of places

...which means it is a cross-cutting challenge for government and civil society

Universities...

....may be part of the problem:

the problem of location

the problem of the UK residential model

...which means that any solution requires deliberative and purposive interventions – something has to change

The Levelling Up White Paper is a cogent analysis

government understands the crosscutting nature of the challenge

seriously under-cooks the potential of universities

Why is the White Paper so unimpressive about the role of universities?

What could universities bring to the challenges of levelling up

Universities need to take their role in place seriously, and especially in the way they relate to (other) places

The current targets for place-based allocation of R&D funds are too conservative

Funding incentives can drive collaboration if there are designed to

Grain size matters: the individual university might be the wrong frame.
